HB 2131 - Update of energy efficiency standards for new commercial and industrial buildings

A letter from Chris Wilson, Kansas Building Industry Association Director of Government Affairs, was distributed to the committee (Attachment 1).

Chairman Holmes opened the debate on HB2131.

Representative Myers moved to strike, in K.S.A. 66-1228, item number one and replace it with "Has been built to meet the energy efficiency standards of the International Energy Conservation Code 2003 or receives a Home Energy Rating score of 80 or greater when performed in accordance with the Mortgage Industry National Home Energy Rating System Accreditation Standard by a rater certified and listed by the Residential Energy Services Network (RESNET)" and in K.S.A. 66-1228 (a) the strike the work 'the buyer' and add the words 'prospective buyers, during contract negotiations, upon request.' Representative Reitz seconded the motion. Representative Sloan moved to divide, the Chairman ruled the question was divisable. On the first part, the motion carried. On the second part, the motion was withdrawn. Representative Myers moved to amend K.S.A. 66-1228 (b) to strike 'the buyer' and add 'prospective buyers, upon request or, at the latest, during contract negotiations,'. Representative Reitz seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Representative Sloan moved to strike the words on line 16 after the word 'the', to strike lines 17 and 18, and to strike on line 19 to the word 'is' and add 'International Energy Conservation Code 2003 (IECC 2003).' Representative Reitz seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Dillmore moved to recommend HB 2131, as amended, favorable for passage. Representative Reitz seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Ward will carry the bill.

HB 2186 - Rules and procedures for disconnecting residential customers' electric or gas utility service

A letter from Tawny Stottlemire, Executive Director for the Kansas Association of Community Action Agencies, was distributed to the committee (Attachment 2).

Chairman Holmes opened the debate on HB 2186.

<u>Representative Huy distributed a proposed amendment (Attachment 3). Representative Huy moved to adopt the amendment.</u> Representative Kassebaum seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative P. Long moved to recommend **HB 2186**, as amended, favorable for passage. Representative Neighbor seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Reitz will carry the bill.

HB 2374 - Procedures for recovery of public utilities' security costs

<u>Representative Sloan moved to recommend HB 2374</u>, with Revisor's technical amendments, favorable for passage. Representative Neighbor seconded the motion. The motion carried Representative Krehbiel will carry the bill.
