MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS.

Chairman Stephen Morris referred the following bills to the KPERS Issues subcommittee:

SB 12--Appointment of officers and employees by KPERS board of trustees
SB 13--Benefits and service credit purchase under KPERS and systems related thereto

Chairman Morris opened the public hearing on:

SB 4--Cash-basis law; exemptions for certain expenditures by school districts

Staff briefed the Committee on the bill.

Dale Dennis, Deputy Commissioner, Kansas State Board of Education, spoke before the committee in support of <u>SB 4</u> (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Mr. Dennis explained that the bill amends the cash basis law to provide an exception when the state is unable to make a state aid payment distribution to school districts within the fiscal year. He also mentioned that the bill would eliminate the audit exception if there is a delayed payment beyond the end of the fiscal year.

Mark Tallman, Assistant Executive Director/Advocacy, Kansas Association of School Boards, spoke before the committee in support of **SB 4** (Attachment 2). Mr. Tallman mentioned that the bill would exempt school districts from the state cash basis law for purchases made in excess of current revenues if the deficit is caused

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by a late distribution of state aid.

There being no further conferees to appear before the committee, the Chairman closed the public hearing on **SB 4**.

Senator Feleciano moved, with a second by Senator Schodorf, to recommend **SB 4** favorable for passage. Motion carried on a roll call vote.

Chairman Morris opened the public hearing on:

SB 6--Racing and gaming commission; eliminating annual financial-compliance audit requirement

Barb Hinton, Legislative Post Auditor, Legislative Division of Post Audit, mentioned that the bill would implement a recommendation from her staff and the Legislative Post Audit Committee for unnecessary audit requirements (<u>Attachment 3</u>). Ms. Hinton explained the reasons for eliminating the unnecessary audit requirements which are listed in her written testimony

There being no further conferees to appear before the committee, the Chairman closed the public hearing on **SB** 6.

Senator Barone moved, with a second by Senator Jackson, to recommend **SB 6** favorable for passage. Motion carried on a roll call vote.
