MINUTES OF THE SENATE FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND INSURANCE COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ruth Teichman at 9:30 A.M. on February 8, 2006 in Room 234-N of the Capitol.

The Chair called the meeting to order and thanked everyone for coming.

The Chair opened hearing on (**SB 495**) and asked Melissa Calderwood to explain the bill. Ms. Calderwood said this bill amends the statutory provision regarding the appointment of the credit union administrator specifically amending K.S.A. 17-2233 to create an expiration date for the administrator's term in office . The expiration date would be December 31, 2009. The bill amends the appointment language to include a provision for the vacancy of term and to allow that the administrator serve the appointed four year term and continue service until a successor is appointed and confirmed. Ms. Calderwood stated that she had spoken with the Governor's appointment secretary following committee discussion on the bill. I was told that the last three terms have had different ending dates, she said.

<u>The Chair recommended favorable passage of (SB 495).</u> Senator Wysong so moved. Senator Schmidt seconded the motion. Motion passed. (SB 495) will move to the full Senate.

The Chair said (<u>SB 468</u>) concerning child support enforcement; relating to payments under an insurance policy and workers' compensation; perfection of a lien; unlawful acts; is ready for final action.

The Chair said there has been good discussion regarding this bill, but said it is her opinion that it should be studied more and would like, instead of passing the bill out, to look at doing an interim study that would involve all of the stakeholders. <u>Senator Brungardt moved (**SB 468**) be recommended for interim study.</u> <u>Senator Barone seconded the motion. Motion passed.</u>

The Chair said (<u>SB 321</u>) - Relates to the Kansas Department of Revenue; providing for the development and implementation of an electronic motor vehicle financial security verification system. She said this bill has been put in Resolution form requesting further study by a task force. The current (<u>SCR</u> <u>**Resolution 1619**</u>) takes everything out of (<u>SB 321</u>) and puts it in the current resolution, she said. In number (2) the likelihood the system would aid law enforcement in the identification of uninsured motorists in this state has been added.

Senator Barone moved favorable passage of this Resolution as amended. Senator Wilson seconded the motion. Motion passed.
