Chairman Umbarger opened the public hearing on:

SB 225--Claims against the state

Staff briefed the committee on the bill.

The Chairman welcomed the following conferees on **<u>SB 225</u>**:

Representative Bonnie Huy, Chairwoman, Special Claims Against the State, provided information to the committee. She explained that during the 2004 interim, excluding motor vehicle fuel tax, the committee heard 146 claims of which 113 were filed by inmates. The value of the claims submitted was \$1.6 quadrillion dollars. Out of that amount, the committee recommended authorizing \$128,146.54 of which \$242.32 of that were inmate claims. The committee recommended \$132,628.48 for motor vehicle fuel tax refunds. The grand total recommended by the committee in **SB 225** was \$260,775.02. (No written testimony was provided.)

Representative Vaughn Flora presented testimony on <u>SB 225</u> on behalf of Representative Tom Sloan (<u>Attachment 1</u>). It was requested that the committee amend <u>SB 225</u> regarding problems between residency determinations by Pittsburg State University and the University of Kansas to authorize that each pay \$3,738.00 for a total of \$7,476.00 to Ms. Terica Gatewood as explained in Representative Sloan's written testimony. Committee questions and discussion followed.

Senator Betts moved, with a second by Senator Barone, to amend **SB 225** to direct the University of Kansas reimburse \$7,476.00 to Ms. Terica Gatewood. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Steineger moved, with a second by Senator Teichman, to amend **SB 225** and adopt a balloon amendment to direct staff to make technical corrections (Attachment 2). Motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Emler moved, with a second by Senator Teichman, to amend **SB 225** and adopt the balloon amendment to authorize and direct the Kansas Department of Administration to pay \$3,660.27 to John Seitz from the Cancelled Warrants Payment Fund as reimbursement for a cancelled warrant (Attachment 3). Motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Emler moved, with a single by Senator Wysong, to amend **SB 225** and adopt the balloon amendment to authorize and direct the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks to pay \$3,000 to Duane Walker from the Parks Fee Fund as reimbursement for damage to claimant's pasture caused by a fire set by a state park patron (Attachment 5). Motion carried on a voice vote. Senator Kelly requested to be recorded as voting "No" on the motion.

Senator Barone moved, with a second by Senator Emler, to report **SB 225** favorable for passage as amended. Motion carried on a roll call vote.
