Chairman Burgess called for any bill introductions:

# HB 2648 Cities, appointments of mayor; governing body approval require unless unfit.

Martha Dorsey briefed the Committee on <u>HB 2648</u>. Martha handed out a paper, that broke the bill down into sections. Each section had a detailed explanation of the bill.

Representative Mike O'Neal appeared in support of <u>HB 2648</u>. Rep. O'Neal states that, certain appointments that a mayor makes, can be refused, or supported by the Commission. The absence of a procedure to address the stalement, thwarts the legislative intent behind mayoral appointments and provides councils with, essentially , the power of a "pocket veto;" the effect in which is to create a "holdover" appointee, situation on a void with respect to a vacant position. Mayoral appointments are subject to approval. (See Attachment 1)

Don Moler testified opposing <u>HB 2648.</u> If such a vacancy problem arises, it is a matter which should be settled at a local level. Specifically, no one is going to make a specific finding by the passage of a resolution that the person is "not fit," to hold office or position. When an occasional dispute arises over this process, we would suggest that the appropriate forum for its discussion, be debated and resolved, would be at the local level. (<u>See Attachment 2</u>)
