## HB 2777: School districts; enrollment; second count-date

Scott Frank, Legislative Post Audit, gave a report to Committee members of the findings, conclusions, and recommendations from their completed performance audit, *K-12 Education: Estimating the Impact of a Second Count Date on School District Funding.* (On file - Legislative Post Audit)

Dale Dennis, Deputy Commissioner, Kansas State Department of Education, explained to Committee members of a computer printout which provided an indication of the additional funding that school districts would receive if there was a second enrollment count on February 20. The increased FTE enrollment would be counted at .5 as provided in <u>SB 459.</u> (Attachment #1)

Representative Pat Colloton urged Committee members to support HB 2777 which allows a school district to receive additional funds when a significant number of new students move into the school district after the September 20 count date. (Attachment #2)

Mark Tallman, Assistant Executive Director/Advocacy, Kansas Association of School Boards, testified before the Committee members in support of <u>HB 2777</u> which would allow districts that increase enrollment over a certain threshold between September 20 and February 20, to receive additional funding for those students. (<u>Attachments #3</u>)

Written testimony was received from Dr. Gary George, Olathe School District in support of <u>HB 2777</u> (<u>Attachment #4</u>)

A question and answer session followed the presentations.
