Representative Goico introduced Intern Blake Baraban, who is a student at the University of Kansas.

Representative Crow requested a bill introduction that would allow veterans and active duty service personnel, who have been victims of identity theft or have experienced security breaches of computerized personal or financial information, to place a security freeze on the account. Representative Crow moved the introduction, seconded by Representative Goico. The motion carried.
