Members continued discussion of a work-group report, which addressed issues of legislative publication cost savings, energy-conservation measures, state-owned properties, non-educational mandates for K-12, senset audits, and standardizing Regents' budgets.

Members agreed that, pending further information, action should be delayed. A member noted that previous attempts to limit legislative statute book distributions had failed. The Chair suggested some items such as sunset provisions could be studied during the summer interim.

A motion was made by Representative Loganbill, seconded by Representative Gatewood, to introduce a House Concurrent Resolution requesting an interim study to explore the following:

- <u>reducing legislative printing and publication expenditures</u>,
- <u>implementing conservation measures</u>,
- <u>purchasing hybrid vehicles</u>,
- <u>eliminating non-education mandates for K-12,</u>
- encouraging sunset audits by Post Audit, and
- <u>standardizing Regents' budgets.</u>

The motion passed.
