Action on <u>HB 2296 - Establishing the joint committee on oversight of the closure of the Kansas</u> neurological institute was opened.

Katherine McBride provided an overview of the proposed balloon amendment (Attachment 1).

Representative Mast made a motion to accept the balloon amendment. Representative McLeland seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Mast made a motion to delete the following from the balloon amendment: page 1 lines 21 through 34 and page 2 lines 1 and 2 but to retain the language in paragraph (4), page 2 of the balloon amendment. Representative Wolf seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Representative Mast made a motion to delete the following items from the balloon amendment: page 3 line 39 from the word "Upon" through line 43 and page 4 lines 1 through 4. Representative McLeland seconded the motion. Motion passed.

<u>Representative Mast made a motion to include language that would exclude individuals who are</u> <u>determined by the Secretary of SRS to be in crisis and individuals who have been in the custody of the</u> <u>state in the foster care program from page 2 paragraph (4) of the balloon amendment. Representative</u> Goodman seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Chairman Crum recognized Ray Dalton who provided information on the development of the savings estimate provided on page 3, section 2(a)(2)(D).

Representative McLeland made a motion to amend page 3, section 2(a)(2)(D) of the balloon amendment to remove the language regarding the \$6,332 figure. Representative Goodman seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Chairman Crum recognized Robert Siedlecki. Secretary Siedlecki supports the bill in its general framework. He does, however, want to ensure any funds saved will go to the developmental disability waiting list so he recommended adding appropriate language to page 4 line 16 to ensure that occurs. This was added by consensus of the committee.

Secretary Siedlecki also brought the member's attention to page 2 section 1(a)(4)(D) and discussed the proposed amendment that would change the way people are assigned to the waiting list. Currently, the waiting list is first-come-first-served regardless of Tier level. The proposed amendment would move Tier 1 (the most severely disabled) people to the top of the waiting list.

Representative McLeland made a motion to eliminate section 1(a)(4)(D) on page 2 of the balloon

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HOUSE BILL No. 2296

AN ACT concerning state institutions and agencies; establishing the joint committee on oversight of the closure of the Kansas neurological institute and the Kansas neurological institute community conversion conservation fund.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on 7 oversight of the closure of the Kansas neurological institute. The joint 8 committee shall review the number of individuals who are transferred 9 from the Kansas neurological institute to home and community based 10 services and the associated cost savings and other outcomes of the 11 money-follows-the-person program. The joint committee shall review the 12 data and information submitted by the Kansas facilities closure and 13 realignment commission regarding community placement costs, proposed 14 costs incurred by the Kansas neurological institute transition of Kansas 15 neurological institute residents to the community and projected savings in 16 the closure of the Kansas neurological institute. The joint committee may 17 consider other data or information that the joint committee deems 18 necessary to review in the joint committee's oversight of the closure of 19 the Kansas neurological institute. 20

(1) The joint committee shall have oversight of savings resulting
from the transfer of individuals from the Kansas neurological institute to
home and community based services. As used in this act, "savings"
means the difference between the average cost of providing services for
individuals in an institutional setting and the cost of providing services in
a home and community based setting.

27 (2) The joint committee shall consider the issues of whether 28 sufficient funding is provided for enhancement of wages and benefits of 29 direct individual care workers, their staff training, and whether adequate 30 progress is being made to transfer individuals from the Kansas 31 neurological institute and to move them from the waiver waiting lists to 32 receive home and community based services.

(3) The joint committee shall review and ensure that any proceeds resulting from a successful transfer of individuals from the Kansas

The first meeting of the joint committee shall be held before August 1, 2011. legislative (d) The members originally appointed as members of the joint

34 committee shall meet upon the call of the member appointed by the 35 speaker of the house of representatives, who shall be the first chairperson, 36 within 30 days of the effective date of this act. The vice-chairperson of 37 the joint committee shall be appointed by the president of the senate. 38 Chairperson and vice-chairperson shall alternate annually between the All 39 members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and the 40 president of the senate. The ranking minority member shall be from the 41 same chamber as the chairperson. The joint committee shall meet at least 42 two four times each year at the call of the chairperson of the joint committee.

(4) No additional individuals shall be added to the home and community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver, except individuals transferred from the Kansas neurological institute to receive services from the home and community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver, until the secretary of social and rehabilitation services provides to the joint committee the following information:

(A) The number of individuals currently receiving services under the home and community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver based upon the individual's score on the developmental disability profile assessment and the level of reimbursement tier that such individual qualifies for;

(B) the number of individuals waiting to receive services under the home and community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver based upon the individual's score on the developmental disability profile assessment and the level of reimbursement tier that such individual qualifies for;

(C) (i) a report of the estimated funding cost over a ten-year period for providing services for individuals currently receiving services and those waiting to receive services under the home and community based services developmental disability medicaid waiver pursuant to subsection (a)(4)(A) and (a)(4)(B); and

(ii) a report of the estimated funding cost over a ten-year period for providing services for individuals currently residing at the Kansas neurological institute and who are transferred to receive services under the home and community based services medicaid waiver; and

(D) evidence of submission of an amendment to the home and community based services medicaid waiver to modify the selection of entrants to the home and community based services medicaid waiver from first-come-first-served to a selection criteria determined by the score achieved on the developmental disability assessment, with priority given to individuals with more severe disabilities that qualify for services. Such an amendment shall be submitted by the department of social and rehabilitation services or the state medicaid agency.

The information in subsection (a)(4) shall be provided by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services to the members of the joint committee prior to the first meeting of the joint committee.

(2) Members appointed by the governor shall serve terms of two years.
