Chairmen Hayzlett and Umbarger opened the meeting with a few remarks. All members introduced themselves by name and districts.

Chairman Hayzlett introduced Secretary of Transportation, Deb Miller who talked to the Committee about some of the issues that are important to the Department of Transportation. Secretary Miller stated that there are 10,000 miles of state highways with more than two million registered vehicles in Kansas. Some of the topics Secretary Miller discussed included: KDOT Resources Strategically Deployed (KDOT employs over 3100 employees), Transportation Funding in Kansas (according to Secretary Miller the main state sources were through motor fuels taxes, registration fees, sales tax and bond proceeds), Funds projected in 2010, Comparison of State Motor Fuels Tax with neighboring states, State Sales Tax History, Federal Funding, Expenditures, Cash Flow, and Debt.(Attachment #1)
