Melissa Wangemann, Legislative Service Director/General Counsel, KS Association of Counties, explained the purpose of <u>SB 129</u> which requires suspension - rather than termination- of medicaid eligibility for persons who are incarcerated in county jails or state correctional facilities (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

Marjorie Phelps, Director of Re-Entry Program, Department of Corrections, testified in support of <u>SB 129</u> addressing the problems caused by delay in reestablishing medicaid eligibility (<u>Attachment 2</u>).

Additional written testimony for <u>SB129</u> was provided by Elizabeth Gillespie, Director, Johnson County Department of Corrections (<u>Attachment 3</u>), and Michelle Sweeney, Policy Analyst, Association of CMHC's of Kansas. (<u>Attachment 4</u>).

Phil Perry, Home Builders Association of Greater Kansas City, spoke in favor of <u>SB 91</u>, an act concerning vesting rights of developers (<u>Attachment 5</u>).

Eric Stafford, Association of General Contractors, supported <u>SB 91</u>. The Associated General Contractors supports legislation which prevents local government from rezoning property once construction has begun. (<u>Attachment 6</u>). He offered a balloon amendment to <u>SB 91</u>.

Chris Wilson, Kansas Building Industry Association, expressed concerns about <u>SB 91</u>. First, that the current law has worked well since passage in 1992 and that the bill would create more problems that it would solve. (<u>Attachment 7</u>)

John Frederico, Home Builders of Greater Kansas City, reemphasized that <u>SB 91</u> is about "property rights", and encouraged the Committee's support of the bill.
