Hearings were opened on **HB 2591 - State education technology network (KAN-ED) established** were opened.

Duane Johnson of the State Library appeared before the committee in support of **HB 2591**. (Attachment 1) Mr. Johnson stressed the importance of the bill, stating that an information network is important to the economy and distance learning.

Craig Grant, KNEA representative, appeared before the committee as a proponent of **HB 2591**. (Attachment 2) He stated that education and economic development go hand in hand, which makes this bill extremely important.
