Chairman Powell said he thought it was important to do the Indian licensure bill by substituting the proposed amendments for the content of  $\underline{SB\ 492}$ .

Revisor Kiernan explained the substitute which would provide that the four Tribes pay for the initial cost of silk screening for the plate and that they then be exempted from the requirement to order 500 plates before they are issued. She said it is basically the same bill described by Natalie Haag at the hearing March 29.

<u>Chairman Powell moved to substitute the proposed provision for issuance of distinctive Tribal license</u> plates for the contents of **SB 492**. Representative Hutchins seconded. Motion to adopt substitute carried.

Representative Hutchins moved, Representative Vining seconded to recommend **Sub SB 492** favorable for passage. Motion carried.

Chairman Powell opened discussion on <u>HR 6006</u>, <u>Attorney General directed to determine</u> constitutionality and to establish that upon conception there is life.

Representative Mayans moved that **HR 6006** be recommended favorable for passage. Representative Vining seconded. Motion carried.

Without objection Minutes of the meetings of March 9, March 13, March 14, March 15 and March 16 were approved.
