Senator Umbarger made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 3, 2000 meeting as submitted. Senator Stephens seconded. The motion carried.

Hearing on: <u>SB 532</u> - <u>concerning livestock; relating to electronic auctions</u>

George Teagarden, Livestock Commissioner, Animal Health Department, testified in support of <u>SB 532</u>, explaining that <u>SB 532</u> would require video and internet auctions to be licensed, collect a per head fee from the Kansas producers using those services, and require health certificates for livestock consigned and sold out of state provide veterinarian inspection for the livestock consigned and sold (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

Senator Umbarger made a motion to adopt the proposed amendment to **SB532** offered by the Livestock Commissioner in Attachment 1. Senator Tyson seconded. The motion carried.

Mike Beam, Kansas Livestock Association, testified in support of <u>SB 532</u>, stating there appeared to be a strong consensus in the Kansas Livestock Association membership that electronic auctions be required to pay the same fees as traditional auction markets (<u>Attachment 2</u>).

Hearing on: <u>SB 533</u> - <u>concerning livestock; relating to brand inspection areas; fees</u>

George Teagarden, Livestock Commissioner, Animal Health Department, testified in support of <u>SB 533</u>, which would allow for a minimum fee and mileage charge for brand inspections (<u>Attachment 3</u>).

Mike Beam, Kansas Livestock Association, testified in support of <u>SB 533</u> to collect a minimum on-site inspection fee and a mileage fee to cover the expense of brand inspection services (<u>Attachment 2</u>).
