MINUTES OF THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE.

The minutes of the February 16th meeting were approved on a motion by Senator Bond, seconded by Senator Vratil. Carried.

Judiciary Subcommittee Chairs reviewed a number of their assigned bills. The following action was taken:

Chair - Senator Vratil <u>SB 446–Kansas administrative procedure act; abuse, neglect or exploitation of adults; regarding</u> <u>investigation by KDHE</u> <u>SB 448–concerning docket fees</u>

<u>SB 505–crime victims restitution; regarding compensation</u>

<u>SB 529–concerning corporations; regarding execution of certain documents</u>

<u>SB 446</u> - <u>Senator Vratil moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by subcommittee, Senator Bond</u> <u>seconded. Discussion. Carried with Senator Pugh voting nay.</u>

<u>SB 448</u> - <u>Senator Vratil moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by subcommittee and place it</u> on the consent calendar, Senator Pugh seconded. Discussion. Carried with Senator Feleciano voting nay.

<u>SB 505</u> - <u>Senator Vratil moved to amend the bill</u> on the recommendation of subcommittee to delete entirely the prohibition from paying such crime victims compensation claims to corporations and other business entities, thus allowing any county to do so and pass it out favorably as amended, Senator Goodwin seconded.</u> <u>Carried</u>

<u>SB 529</u> - <u>Senator Vratil moved to amend the bill on the recommendation of subcommittee to include a</u> provision that sets a procedure for an existing Kansas corporation to convert to a holding company structure in which the existing Kansas corporation becomes a wholly owned operating subsidiary of a new Kansas holding company and pass the bill out favorably as amended, Senator Goodwin seconded. Carried. (attachment 1)

SB 224-concerning district coroners; notification and investigation of deaths

<u>SB 528</u>–concerning the Chemical Control Act; regarding practitioners

SB 578-concerning courts; regarding collection of debts owed.

SB 585-civil procedure; regarding depositions; preferential pricing of reporting services

SB 488-regarding sentencing in multiple conviction cases

<u>SB 485–nonprobate transfer on death; regarding nontestamentary nature</u>

<u>SB 224</u> - <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee and place</u> it on the consent calendar, Senator Bond seconded. Carried.

<u>SB 528</u> - <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee and place</u> it on the consent calendar, Senator Bond seconded. Carried.

<u>SB 578</u> - Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill, Senator Vratil seconded. Following discussion both senators withdrew their motions and no further action was taken on the bill at this time.

<u>SB 585</u> - <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee, Senator</u> Donovan seconded. Carried.

<u>SB 488</u> - <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee, Senator</u>

<u>Goodwin seconded. Carried.</u> <u>SB 485</u> - <u>Senator Pugh moved to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee, Senator</u> Feleciano seconded. Carried. (attachment 2)

Chair - Senator Emert <u>SB 559–concerning electronic transfers</u>

<u>SB 559</u> - <u>Senator Goodwin moved to amend the bill by striking the language on page 2 at line 22 beginning</u> with "The" and all of lines 23 and 24 and beginning on page 8, all of sections 17,18, and 19 as recommended by the subcommittee and pass the bill out favorably as amended, Senator Vratil seconded. Carried. (attachment 3)</u>

SB 370-concerning children; regarding guardians ad litem

<u>SB 461–concerning CINC; regarding permanent guardianship</u>

SB 490-regarding community corrections; placement of offenders

<u>SB 491–regarding probation and suspension of sentence; jail confinement; conditional violators;</u> postrelease supervision

<u>SB 546–regarding placement and conveyance of certain offenders; reception and diagnostic center</u> <u>SB 583–criminal prosecution of juvenile offenders; regarding traffic offenses</u>

SB 370 - Following discussion on the bill, there was general consensus to take no action at this time.

SB 461 - Senator Oleen moved to amend the bill to include Conferee Judge Graeber's recommendations and to pass the bill out favorably as recommended by the subcommittee, Senator Vratil seconded. Carried. **SB 490, 491, 546, and 583** - Following discussion Committee decided to revisit these bills on 2-22. (attachment 4)

Chair - Senator Goodwin

<u>SB 386–concerning crime and punishment; regarding inquisitions; subpoenas</u> <u>SB 384–regarding indecent and aggravated indecent solicitation of a child; creating crime of electronic</u> <u>harassment</u>

<u>SB 386</u> - Following discussion Senator Goodwin moved to amend the bill to delete "computer crime" and replace it with "any crime involving a computer" as recommended by the subcommittee and pass the bill out favorably, Senator Vratil seconded. Carried with Senators Harrington, Donovan, Pugh, and Petty voting nay. <u>SB 384</u> - following discussion, it was the consensus of the Committee to take no action on the bill at this time. (attachment 5)
