SUB HB 2642 Increasing maximum length for recreational vehicles

John J. Federico, Federico Consulting speaking on behalf of the Recreational Vehicle Industry Association, addressed the need for this bill. It is merely an attempt to bring conformity to existing state statutes (<u>Attachment 1</u>). He corrected the written testimony; stating that while it is not illegal to sell a motor home longer than 42 and one-half feet within Kansas, it is illegal to drive one in Kansas.

No one spoke in opposition to SUB. HB 2642.

Members were advised this bill would not apply to "stinger steering" (trailers) type vehicles. Following additional questions and discussion. <u>Senator Salmans moved to recommend the bill favorable for passage</u>. <u>Senator</u> <u>Stephens seconded the motion</u>. <u>Motion carried</u>. Senator Vidricksen will carry the bill.,
