**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2075 by Representative Brunk, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2075 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2075 would amend existing law to establish Room 221-E as the capitol meditation room. This room would be used solely as a place for prayer and meditation.

The Executive Director of the State Historical Society is also the Chair of the Capitol Preservation Committee, which approves renovations of the state capitol, as well as oversees changes to the uses of the committee rooms. The State Historical Society indicates that passage of HB 2075 would have no fiscal effect on the state budget. The Department of Administration has not yet responded to a request for information on any fiscal effect it might experience from passage of HB 2075, but because this is a room in the capitol building which is currently maintained, passage of the bill is not expected to have any fiscal effect on the agency.
