SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2114 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2114 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2114 would require the party requesting a business records subpoena to give notice of the request to all parties and any person who possessed the requested individual or jointly held personal or business records. In addition, within seven days after the receipt of the requested records, the requesting party would notify all parties and any person whose individual or jointly held personal or business records were requested to allow access to and copying of such records.

The passage of HB 2114 would not have a fiscal effect on the Judiciary.
