New Sec. 28. (a) If a student submits an application for free meals under the national school lunch act on or before the date on which the enrollment of the school district is calculated and it is later determined by the school district or the department of education that the student should not have been eligible for free meals, the school district or the department shall notify the state board of such determination. Except as provided in subsection (b), upon receipt of such notice, the state board shall recompute the adjusted enrollment of the school district and the general fund budget of the school district based on the adjusted enrollment of the school district excluding the at-risk student weighting and high density at-risk student weighting, if any, assigned to such student.

(b) If a student becomes ineligible to receive free meals under the national school lunch act for failure to submit, in a timely manner, any documentation necessary for verification of eligibility as required by the national school lunch act, but subsequently submits such documentation, such student shall not be excluded from the calculation of the adjusted enrollment of the school district if the school district forwards a copy of such documentation to the state board no later than January 14 of the school year.

New Sec. 29. (a) There is hereby established in every school district an at-risk education fund, which shall consist of all moneys deposited therein or transferred thereto according to law. The expenses of a school district directly attributable to providing at-risk student assistance or programs shall be paid from the at-risk education fund.

(b) Any balance remaining in the at-risk education fund at the end of the budget year shall be carried forward into the at-risk education fund for succeeding budget years. Such fund shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 79-2925 through 79-2937, and amendments thereto. In preparing the budget of such school district, the amounts credited to and the amount on hand in the at-risk education fund, and the amount expended therefrom shall be included in the annual budget for the information of the residents of the school district.

- (c) Expenditures from the at-risk education fund of a school district shall only be made for the following purposes:
- (1) At-risk educational programs approved by the state board;
- (2) personnel providing educational services in conjunction with such programs; and
- (3) services contracted for by the school district to provide at-risk

- (1) If the enrollment of the school district is at least 35% at-risk students, but less than 50% at-risk students:
- (A) Subtract 35% from the percentage of at-risk students in the enrollment of the school district;
- (B) multiply the difference determined under subsection (b)(1)
- (A) by 0.7; and
- (C) multiply the product determined under subsection (b)(1)(B) by the enrollment of at-risk students in the school district. The resulting product is the high-density at-risk student weighting of the school district; or
- (2) if the enrollment of the school district is 50% or more at-risk students, multiply the number of at-risk students by 0.105. The resulting product is the high-density at-risk student weighting of the school district.
