- (c) In determining the amount produced by the tax levied by the school district under authority of this section, the state board shall include any moneys apportioned to the declining enrollment fund of the school district from taxes levied under the provisions of K.S.A. 79-5101 et seq. and 79-5118 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (d) The declining enrollment weighting of a school district shall be determined by the state board in each school year in which such weighting may be assigned to the foundation enrollment of the school district. The state board shall divide the amount certified under subsection (a)(2) by the BASE aid. The resulting quotient is the declining enrollment weighting of the school district.

- (e) As used in this section:
- (1) "Declining enrollment" means an enrollment that has declined in amount from that of the preceding school year.
- (2) "School district" means a school district that: (A) Has a declining enrollment; and (B) has adopted a local option budget in an amount that equals at least 5% of the total foundation aid for the school district at the time the school district applies to the state board of tax appeals for authority to make a levy pursuant to this section.
- (f) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2018.
- New Sec. 34. For the purpose of determining the general fund budget of a school district, weightings shall not be assigned to a student enrolled in and attending KAMS. Moneys in the general fund that are attributable to a student enrolled in and attending KAMS shall not be included in the computation of the local enhancement budget of the school district.

- New Sec. 35. (a) There is hereby established in every school district a career and postsecondary education fund, which shall consist of all moneys deposited therein or transferred thereto according to law. All moneys received by a school district for any course or program authorized and approved under the provisions of article 44 of chapter 72 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, except for courses and programs conducted in an area vocational school, shall be credited to the career and postsecondary education fund. All moneys received by the school district from tuition, fees or charges or from any other source for career and postsecondary education fund.
