They work closely with all trade members and help us to understand the importance of the work we complete.

To be honest, we always thought their projects were tax exempt, and were a little confused when we found out they were not.

We do know that Friends uses local companies, and take the time to make sure that work is done right. They research best practices, research different types of material and work with many local tradesman, such as Spartan/Ram Jack Foundation, Polar Aire, Eaton Roofing, Wheatland Contracting and us, Meyer Remodeling & Repair.
