The next morning when they pick the child up they take the child to the local office and have her sit all day because she does not have a permanent placement which means she is no longer in school. This is especially true among children that come to us from surrounding cities.

Children that are not placed in a home for permanent placement are not allowed to enroll because we do not have a placement agreement for them. Therefore, they go back to the agency and sit there all day. I would like to see a bill that will allow a child to go to school from the agency's address so that we can cut down on children not in school and that will in-turn boost testing scores, self-esteem and a feeling of belonging. Unfortunately, this is a vicious cycle which many times cause a child to miss 30 days of school at a time.
