Chairman Finch and Committee Members:

My name is Kirk Thompson and I serve as the Director of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. Per K.S.A. 74-5606, I also serve as a statutory member of the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (KSCPOST). Thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony in support of House Bill 2069, which seeks to include deferred judgment agreements for certain misdemeanor and felony offenses in the definition of applicable convictions. This change is important as it relates to qualifications of applicants for law enforcement certification in Kansas.

The mission of KSCPOST is to ensure the citizens of Kansas are provided with qualified, trained, ethical, competent, and professional peace officers.
