SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2210 by House Committee on Local Government

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2210 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Current law prohibits cities and towns from prohibiting the placement or number of political signs on private property or the unpaved right of way on a city street or county road on private property during the 45-day period before an election and the two-day period following an election. HB 2210 would amend the law to refer to “temporary” rather than “political” signs and give cities and counties the ability to regulate temporary signs during the specified time periods and locations in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the cities and counties.

According to the Kansas Association of Counties and the League of Kansas Municipalities, enactment of HB 2210 would have no fiscal effect.
