SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2291 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2291 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2291 would specify that a patient whose status as an inmate in the custody of the Secretary of Corrections has expired would be transferred to the custody of the sheriff of the county where the district court with jurisdiction over the commitment proceeding is located, pending admission to a state psychiatric hospital.

According to the Kansas Department of Corrections, enactment of HB 2291 would have no fiscal effect. The Kansas Association of Counties states enactment of the bill could result in additional expenditures to counties; however, the Association cannot estimate a fiscal effect.
