**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2530 by House Committee on Children and Seniors

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2530 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2530 would add certified emergency medical services attendants to the list of individuals required to report suspected abuse, neglect or exploitation of residents of adult care homes; medical care facilities; state psychiatric hospitals; or any adult in need of protective services. Emergency medical services attendants would be required to file reports with the Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF), the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS), or to an appropriate law enforcement agency if DCF and KDADS are not available. HB 2530 would make failure of an emergency medical services attendant to report suspected abuse, neglect or exploitation a class B misdemeanor.

The Emergency Medical Services Board, Department for Aging and Disability Services, Department of Health and Environment, and Department for Children and Families indicate that HB 2530 would have no fiscal effect.
