**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 6 by Senator Faust-Goudeau

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 6 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 6 would require all Kansas law enforcement agencies to adopt a detailed, written policy relating to the procedures to be employed when inquiring about the possession of firearms by an individual during an enforcement action. Policies would be implemented by all Kansas law enforcement agencies within two years after the effective date of the bill and would be available for public inspection during normal business hours. The bill specifies the basic parameters required of any policy and defines the meaning of "enforcement action."

The Attorney General states as a law enforcement agency it would be required to adopt a policy as specified in the bill, which could be accomplished within existing resources. The League of Kansas Municipalities and the Kansas Association of Counties state developing a policy as required by SB 6 would take additional staff time and training; however, any fiscal effect would be negligible to local governments. Both the Kansas Bureau of Investigation and the Kansas Highway Patrol would be required to develop a policy for each agency, which could be done within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 6 is not reflected in *The FY 2018 Governor's Budget Report*.
