

## House Concurrent Resolution No. 5024

1 A PROPOSITION to amend article 11 of the constitution of the state of  
2 Kansas by adding a new section thereto, concerning the taxation of  
3 certain residential property.

5 *Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the*  
6 *members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of*  
7 *Representatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed)*  
8 *and qualified to the Senate concurring therein:*

9 Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of  
10 the state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state  
11 for their approval or rejection: Article 11 of the constitution of the state of  
12 Kansas is hereby amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

13 "**§ 14. Taxation of certain residential property;**  
14 **state levy.** (a) There is hereby levied an annual permanent state  
15 tax of 10 mills upon property classified in subclass 1 of section  
16 11 of article 11 of the constitution of the state of Kansas with an  
17 appraised value of \$1,000,000 or more.

18 (b) The county treasurer of each county shall make  
19 the proceeds of the tax levy provided for in this section  
20 available to the state treasurer immediately upon collection.  
21 When available, the state treasurer shall withdraw from each  
22 county the proceeds of the taxes raised by such tax levy. Upon  
23 such withdrawal, the state treasurer shall deposit the same in the  
24 state treasury and shall credit the entire amount to the state  
25 general fund."

26 Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with  
27 the amendment as a whole:

28 "*Explanatory statement.* The purpose of this amendment is to  
29 levy a tax upon residential property with an appraised value  
30 of \$1,000,000 or more. The proceeds of this levy would be  
31 deposited into the state general fund.

32 "A vote for this proposition would provide a state tax of 10  
33 mills on residential property with an appraised value of  
34 \$1,000,000 or more and deposit the proceeds therefrom into  
35 the state general fund.

36 "A vote against this proposition would make no changes in

1           current law with no additional tax levy on residential  
2           property with an appraised value of \$1,000,000 or more."

3           Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members  
4           elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives, and  
5           two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the  
6           Senate shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays.  
7           The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as  
8           provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted  
9           to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year  
10          2018, unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent  
11          resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the  
12          electors of the state at the special election.
