HB 2416 Oral Neutral Testimony Robyn Herzog

My name is Robyn Herzog. I am a self advocate who knows firsthand the benefits of working in the community and making at least minimum wage. I live in my own apartment and pay my own bills.

When I worked in a sheltered workshop, I was only paid \$1.50 per hour. Needless to say that made it very difficult for me to afford to pay my bills.

Thankfully, I now work in the community at One Of A Kind Daycare and make a real wage. Being in the community is so important to me as I love what I do. I make real money, and also have made some great friends along the way. I want you to help other Kansans with disabilities to have an opportunity to work in the community too.

While I do not support HB2416 as it was drafted, I would be in support of it with the DRC amendment. With the amendment, this is a great opportunity to help more Kansans with disabilities to be able to work in the community making at least minimum wage like me.
