Mr. Chairman and Committee members:

Thank you for giving me this opportunity to appear before you as a proponent of HB 2329. This bill in its simplest terms increases the contribution rate for employees of the Kansas Department of Education. The bill also increases the employee's salaries by an identical amount to meet obligations stated within the Kansas Constitution.

The reasoning for offering such a mandate is directly related to the unfunded liability of the KPERS system. Currently, the largest portion of unfunded liability is within the "teacher's" portion of the plan. The last I checked, their portion accounted for about seven million dollars of the more than nine million dollars of unfunded liability. Something must be done to ensure the health and longevity of the overall pension system in our state.

My preference would be for those contributions by both the employee and employer be paid quarterly to the KPERS fund by mandate. This would mean that the state contributions would no longer be available for legislative or executive manipulation that allows either partial payments, no payment, or delayed payments.
