SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2471 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2471 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2471 would require members of Kansas Criminal Justice Reform Commission who are not legislators or public employees to receive mileage, tolls and parking as provided in KSA 75-3223 for attendance at any meeting of the Commission or any subcommittee meeting authorized by the Commission. The bill defines public employee as an employee of the State of Kansas, any employee of a city incorporated under the laws of the State of Kansas or any employee of a county, township, school district or other political subdivision of the State of Kansas..

The Legislative Coordinating Council (LCC) indicates HB 2471 would increase costs for reimbursement of travel and subsistence by \$7,189 from the State General Fund in FY 2021 for the five members of the Kansas Criminal Justice Reform Commission who are not legislators or public employees. The estimate includes \$6,469 for mileage reimbursement, \$270 for tolls, and \$450 for parking and assumes average mileage of 250 miles roundtrip. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2471 is not reflected in *The FY 2021 Governor's Budget Report*.
