AN ACT concerning education; relating to school districts; requiring 1 publication of bullying policies; report on bullying incidents at each 2 attendance center; amending K.S.A. 72-6147 and repealing the existing 3 4 section. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-6147 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8 6147. (a) As used in this section: 9 (1) "Bullying" means: (A) Any intentional gesture or any intentional written, verbal, 10 11 electronic or physical act or threat either by any student, staff member or 12 parent towards a student or by any student, staff member or parent towards 13 a staff member that is sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that such gesture, act or threat creates an intimidating, threatening or abusive 14 a reasonable person, 15 educational environment that under the circumstances, knows or should know will have the effect of: 16 (i) Harming a student or staff member, whether physically or 17 18 mentally; 19 (ii) damaging a student's or staff member's property; 20 (iii) placing a student or staff member in reasonable fear of harm to 21 the student or staff member; or 22 (iv) placing a student or staff member in reasonable fear of damage to 23 the student's or staff member's property; 24 (B) cyberbullying; or (C) any other form of intimidation or harassment prohibited by the 25 26 board of education of the school district in policies concerning bullying 27 adopted pursuant to this section or subsection (e) of K.S.A. 72-1138(e), 28 and amendments thereto. 29 (2) "Cyberbullying" means bullying by use of any electronic 30 communication device through means including, but not limited to, e-mail, 31 instant messaging, text messages, blogs, mobile phones, pagers, online games and websites. 32 33 (3) "Parent" includes a guardian, custodian or other person with 34 authority to act on behalf of the child. 35 (4) "School district" or "district" means any unified school district 36 organized and operating under the laws of this state.

1 (5) "School vehicle" means any school bus, school van, other school 2 vehicle and private vehicle used to transport students or staff members to 3 and from school or any school-sponsored activity or event.

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(6) "Staff member" means any person employed by a school district.

5 (b) The board of education of each school district shall adopt a policy 6 to prohibit bullying either by any student, staff member or parent towards 7 a student or by a student, staff member or parent towards a staff member 8 on or while utilizing school property, in a school vehicle or at a school-9 sponsored activity or event.

10 (c) The board of education of each school district shall adopt and 11 implement a plan to address bullying either by any student, staff member 12 or parent towards a student or by a student, staff member or parent towards 13 a staff member on school property, in a school vehicle or at a school-14 sponsored activity or event. Such plan shall include *a bullying reporting* 15 *and resolution process and* provisions for the training and education for 16 staff members and students.

(d) The board of education of each school district may adopt
additional policies relating to bullying pursuant to-subsection (e) of K.S.A.
72-1138(e), and amendments thereto.

20 (e) (1) Any policy to prohibit bullying, any plan to address bullying 21 and any bullying reporting and resolution process adopted by a school 22 district shall be:

(A) Published on the school district's website with a link prominently
 posted on the homepage of each such website;

(B) published on the website of any attendance center that has its own website with a link prominently posted on the homepage of such website. If an attendance center has its own bullying policy, plan or reporting and resolution process, such policy, plan or reporting and resolution process shall also be published on the attendance center's website;

31 *(C)* distributed annually to parents and guardians upon enrollment of 32 a student in such school district;

33 (D) included in any school district or school handbook; and

(E) included in any staff training materials.

35 (2) As used in this subsection, "bullying reporting and resolution 36 process" includes:

(A) Reporting procedures, including anonymous reporting
 procedures;

(B) reporting forms;

40 *(C)* names of school district and attendance center personnel to 41 whom reports are made or delivered;

42 (D) a timeline for resolving bullying incidents;

43 (E) interventions and consequences for victims and perpetrators of

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1 bullying; and

2 (F) training and educational requirements or materials for students 3 and school staff members.

4 (3) Any information published or distributed pursuant to paragraph 5 (1) shall include instructions for the public on how to obtain and view any 6 training and educational requirements or materials for students and 7 school staff members.

8 (f) (1) Each school district shall annually submit to the state board of 9 education a report containing the following information for each 10 attendance center within the school district for the preceding school year:

11 (A) The number of unique bullying incidents reported, including, but 12 not limited to, the number of unique victims, the number of unique 13 perpetrators and whether or not such incidents were anonymous or in-14 person;

(B) the types of bullying incidents reported, including, but not limited
 to, physical bullying, verbal bullying, cyberbullying or indirect bullying;
 and

18 (*C*) the number of reported bullying incidents resolved in each of the 19 following manners:

20 *(i) Counseling and remediation;*

- 21 *(ii) in-school suspension;*
- 22 *(iii) out-of-school suspension;*
- 23 *(iv) expulsion;*

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24 (v) referral to law enforcement;

- 25 (vi) a finding of no bullying incident; and
- 26 (vii) any other method of resolution.

(2) Each school district shall publish the report submitted pursuant
to paragraph (1) on the school district's website with a link prominently
posted on the homepage of such website. Each attendance center that has
its own website shall publish the information in the report submitted
pursuant to paragraph (1) that is specific to such attendance center on its
website with a link prominently posted on the homepage of such website.

(3) The state board of education shall annually compile the reports
submitted pursuant to paragraph (1) and prepare a summary report that
shall be submitted to the senate committee on education and the house of
representatives committee on education.

(g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or supersede or
in any manner affect or diminish the requirements of compliance by a staff
member with the provisions of K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 38-2223 or 38-2226,
and amendments thereto.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 72-6147 is hereby repealed.
