SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 53

As Amended by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

SB 53, as amended, would designate the official Kansas red wine grape as chambourcin and the official Kansas white wine grape as vignoles.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the Kansas Register.

Background

The bill was introduced by the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs at the request of Senators Holland, Alley, Baumgardner, Braun, Francisco, Haley, Lynn, McGinn, and Ware.

During the Senate Committee hearing, representatives of the Kansas Grape Growers and Winemakers Association and the Kansas Viticulture & Farm Winery Association testified in support of the bill. Proponents testified both grape varietals have long been grown in Kansas and are still being grown across the state.

Written-only proponent testimony was provided by the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism.

The Senate Committee recommended the bill be placed on the Consent Calendar.

During the hearing in the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs, representatives of the Kansas Viticulture & Farm Winery Association and the Kansas Grape Growers and Winemakers Association testified in support of the bill.

Written-only proponent testimony was provided by the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism.

No other testimony was provided.

The House Committee amended the bill to be effective upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, the Department of Agriculture and the Secretary of State indicate enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on either agency.
