Re: Prison Bed Impact Assessment, **HB 2191 - Increasing criminal penalties**

for the crimes of riot and incitement to riot when the crime occurs in a

correctional facility.

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- Impact on Prison Admissions: This bill would result in 0 to 2 additional prison admissions each year during the forecast period.
- Impact on Prison Beds: This bill would result in 0 to 2 additional prison beds in FY 2022 and 1 to 3 additional prison beds in FY 2031.
- Impact on the Workload of the Commission: This bill would result in 0 to 3 additional journal entries each year for the workload of the Commission.

SUMMARY OF THE BILL

K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 21-6201 is amended to make the crime of **riot** a **severity level 8**, **person felony**, if the riot occurs in a correctional facility. The current severity level is a class A, person misdemeanor. Additionally, the crime of **incitement to riot** is a **severity level 6**, **person felony**, if the incitement to riot occurs in a correctional facility. The current severity level is **severity level 8**, **person felony**.

This bill also defines "correctional facility" to mean a "correctional institution" as defined in K.S.A. 75-5202, and amendments thereto, or a jail.

KEY ASSUMPTIONS

 Projected admission to prison for the target offender is assumed to increase by an annual average of 1.0% in FY 2022 and 1.5.% from FY 2023 to FY 2031, which is the same percentage used in relation to the baseline prison population forecast produced in August 2020 by the Kansas Sentencing Commission.

- Scenario One: It is assumed that one offender will be convicted of the crime as defined in either subsections (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with one sentenced to probation.
- **Scenario Two**: It is assumed that **two** offenders will be convicted of the crime as defined in either subsections (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with **one** sentenced to probation and **one** sentenced to prison.
- Scenario Three: It is assumed that **three** offenders will be convicted of the crime as defined in subsection (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with **one** sentenced to probation and **two** sentenced to prison.
- The average length of sentence is assumed to be **39 months** for **severity level six** crimes.
- The average length of sentence is assumed to be **18 months** for **severity level eight** crimes.
- It is assumed that the effective date is on July 1, 2021.

FINDINGS

- In FY 2019, **0** offenders were **convicted** of the inciting a riot under K.S.A. 21-6201.
- In FY 2019, **0** offenders were **admitted** to prison for inciting a riot under K.S.A. 21-6201.

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- **Scenario One:** If **one** offender is convicted of the crime as defined in (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with **one** sentenced to probation:
 - o FY 2022, **0** prison beds would be needed; and
 - o FY 2031, **0** prison bed would be needed.
- Scenario Two: If two offenders are convicted of the crime as defined in subsection (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with one sentenced to probation and one sentenced to prison, by:
 - o FY 2022, 1 prison bed would be needed; and
 - o FY 2031, 2 prison beds would be needed.
- Scenario Three: If three offenders are convicted of the crime as defined in subsection (c)(1)(A) or (c)(1)(B) each year with one sentenced to probation and two sentenced to prison, by:
 - o FY 2022, 2 prison bed would be needed; and
 - o FY 2031, 3 prison beds would be needed.

SUMMARY

• Impact on Prison Admissions: This bill would result in 0 to 2 additional prison admissions each year during the forecast period.

- Impact on Prison Beds: This bill would result in 0 to 2 additional prison beds in FY 2022 and 1 to 3 additional prison beds in FY 2031.
- Impact on the Workload of the Commission: This bill would result in 0 to 3 additional journal entries each year for the workload of the Commission.
