Make no mistake; there is a public outcry for a LOFTON LAW to prevent another youth killed as Cedric Lofton was. I speak for Voters and Constituents.

On behalf of our Children of Kansas, we urge that the evidence-based testimony of Commissioner Jim Howell become law for the children of Kansas.

Together, the Lofton Law WRAP and PRONE testimony produces a valid law. Mitigating Kansas children's deaths by removing punitive restraints that lead to criminal investigations helps to protect all children outside of their homes.

Kansans do not believe in killing children and respect the common ground to keep all of our children alive. We support you to run forward without delay and pass the Lofton Law.

The evidence-based testimony of HB 367 will have a compelling effect on the safety of all children of Kansas growing into adults and will lessen the burden of the State's safety net.
