Subject: Bill Brief on SB 366

Senate Bill 366 specifies that the crime of burglary includes, without authority, entering into or remaining within any locked or secured portion of any dwelling, building or other structure, with intent to commit another crime therein.

The bill amends K.S.A. 21-5807, which defines the crime of burglary. Current law prohibits, without authority, entering into or remaining within any dwelling, building or other structure, with intent to commit another crime therein any dwelling, building or other structure, with intent to commit another crime therein. The bill adds language in four separate places to prohibit, without authority, entering into or remaining within <u>any locked or secured portion of</u> any dwelling, building or other structure, with intent to commit another crime therein.
