House Committee on Health and Human Services

- (i) "Person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association or other entity.
- (j) "Instructor-in-training" means a person who is a licensed cosmetologist and has met the board's training requirements for obtaining an instructor-in-training permit.
- (k) "Physician" means a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery by the state board of healing arts.
- (l) "Threading" means a method of temporary hair removal from the face or any part of the body by use of a strand of thread to pull hair from follicles. "Threading" may include the use of over-the-counter astringents, gels, powders, tweezers or scissors incidental to threading, but does not include the use of chemicals, {electric needles,} heat or any type of wax.
- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-1928 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-1928. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall develop a brochure containing information about infection control techniques—which that are appropriate for hair braiding and threading outside the salon setting. This brochure shall be made available through the department of health and environment's website or by mail, upon request, for a fee to cover the department of health and environment's printing costs. The brochure shall contain a self-test with questions on the information contained in the brochure.
- (b) For an individual engaged in hair braiding or threading to be exempt from the practice of cosmetology under K.S.A. 65-1901, and amendments thereto, such individual shall complete the self-test part of the brochure and keep the brochure and completed self-test available at the location-at which where the individual is braiding hair or threading.
 - Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-1901 and 65-1928 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
