unlawful possession of marijuana and defining complaint in the Kansas code of

criminal procedure to include such notice to appear.

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

• Impact on Prison Admissions and Beds: This bill will have no impact on prison admissions, beds, or the journal entry workload of the Commission.

SUMMARY OF BILL

Section 1. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 22-2202 is amended to read that a complaint includes a citation or notice to appear issued by a law enforcement officer pursuant to and in compliance with K.S.A. 8-2106, a citation or notice to appear issued pursuant to and in compliance with K.S.A. 32-1049; or a notice to appear issued by a law enforcement officer pursuant to K.S.A. 22-2408, for a violation of K.S.A. 21-5706, when the substance involved is marijuana.

FINDINGS

- In FY 2019, there were **235** convictions for felony possession of marijuana under K.S.A. 21-5706.
 - \circ 16 (6.8%) were sentenced to prison
 - o 219 (93.2%) were sentenced to probation
 - All were severity level 5 drug felonies
- This bill only addresses notices to appear on a charge. Thus, this bill will not directly impact sentencing outcomes.

SUMMARY

• Impact on Prison Admissions and Beds: This bill will have no impact on prison admissions, beds, or the journal entry workload of the Commission.
