Thank you for the opportunity to supply written testimony in support of House Bill 2542, which would hold people accountable for their actions towards sports officials. As a local League Commissioner, I am greatly concerned with protecting the safety of all sports officials.

As the State of Kansas continues to see the decline in people wanting to be sports officials, the passing of this bill would give us another tool in the recruitment process. Passing of this bill will allow us to let new officials know they are protected while officiating. The State of Kansas is in a CRISIS when it comes to its number of officials. According to a recent study done by the Kansas Sports Officials Association, we are down 23.8% in total for all sports officials across our State.

As KSHSAA states, school-based athletics is an extension of the classroom, therefore respect and appropriate behavior should be upheld.
