Subject: House Bill No. 2272

Summary

House Bill No. 2272 provides for the escrowing of certain taxes paid under protest and providing notice by the county appraiser to other taxing entities.

<u>Section 1</u> –The county appraiser is required to provide the county clerk by June 1 the certified list of all real properties that are protesting the valuation or assessment and appraised greater than \$40,000 and seeking an exemption from property taxes. The clerk shall provide the list to each taxing jurisdiction potentially impacted.

<u>Section 2</u> – The county treasurer is required to provide before January 10 to each taxing jurisdiction a certified list of all real properties that have tax dollars escrowed.

<u>Section 3</u> – The county treasurer shall place in a trust account in escrow and shall not distribute the portion of taxes exceeding the prior year's taxes until final appeal if the amount of tax on: (1) residential property exceeds the prior year by \$500 or more; or (2) commercial property exceeds the prior year by \$5,000 or more.

The escrow provision does not apply to newly constructed structures unless the appraisal exceeds the building permit enumerated costs by 115%.
