My name is Ford Miller, and I am a Kansas voter. I urge you to pass House Bill 2461. Eliminating sales tax on critical hygienic necessities can only improve the lives of Kansans, especially the most vulnerable among us. Continuing to tax those items enumerated in subsection (0000) is, frankly, discriminatory.

For example, those who menstruate only constitute a (significant) fraction of the population, yet they are saddled with a tax burden on top of the cost of the product itself, to manage an unavoidable anatomical event they have not chosen.
