Good morning Chairman Kerschen and members of the committee, the members of Corn, Grain Sorghum, Soybeans and Wheat Kansas Commodity Associations stand in support of this bill which seeks to amend the agricultural and specialty chemical remediation act. The remediation fund receives no money from the state general fund and is wholly financed by agricultural businesses that support Kansas corn producers.

HB 2103 would allow the remediation fund to help pay for the safe collection and disposal of pesticide waste materials. Our members and input suppliers strive to dispose of associated waste (containers, unused agricultural inputs, etc.) using environmentally friendly and economical methods. This bill will provide much needed financial resources to develop systems to ensure that proper disposal methods are met. There is adequate funding in the remediation fund for this proposed expenditure. Most importantly, since the fund is financed by agricultural businesses, it is appropriate to utilize these funds for these purposes.
