SENATE BILL No. 43

AN ACT concerning postsecondary education; relating to the state board of regents; creating the Kansas promise scholarship act and the Kansas promise scholarship program fund.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Sections 1 through 6, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas promise scholarship act.

- (b) As used in the Kansas promise scholarship act:
- (1) "Eligible institution" means:
- (A) Any community college or technical college established under the laws of this state;
 - (B) the Washburn institute of technology; or
- (C) any not-for-profit institution of postsecondary education with its main campus or principal place of operation in Kansas that offers a promise eligible program, is operated independently and not controlled or administered by any state agency or subdivision of the state, maintains open enrollment and is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency for higher education in the United States.
 - (2) "Eligible student" means a person who:
 - (A) Is a resident of Kansas; and
- (B) (i) has recently graduated from an accredited Kansas public or private secondary school within the preceding 12 months;
- (ii) has recently completed the requirements for graduation at a non-accredited private secondary school as provided in K.S.A. 72-4345, and amendments thereto, within the preceding 12 months;
- (iii) has recently obtained a high school equivalency certificate after attending attended an accredited Kansas public or private secondary school or non-accredited private school as provided in K.S.A. 72-4345, and amendments thereto, and obtained a high school equivalency certificate within the preceding 12 months;
- (iv) is 21 years of age or older and, upon application for a scholarship, has been a resident of Kansas for three or more consecutive years; or

(v) is a dependent child of a military servicemember permanently stationed in another state and recently graduated or completed the requirements for high school graduation at who, within the preceding 12 months, graduated from any out-of-state secondary school or obtained a high school equivalency certificate.

- (3) "Part-time student" means a student who is enrolled for six credit hours or more in a semester and not enrolled as a full-time student.
- "Promise eligible program" means any two-year associate degree program or career and technical education certificate or stand-alone program offered by an eligible institution and identified by the state board pursuant to section 4, and amendments thereto, as a "promise eligible program" in any of the following fields of study:
 - (A) Information technology and security;
 - (B) physical and mental healthcare; or
 - (C) advanced manufacturing and building trades; or
 - (D) early childhood education and development.
 - (4)(5) "State board" means the state board of regents.
- Sec. 2. (a) (1) There is hereby established the Kansas promise scholarship program. Subject to appropriations therefor, a scholarship may be awarded to any eligible student who enrolls in a promise eligible program at an eligible institution. The scholarship amount shall be the aggregate amount of tuition, required fees and the cost of books and required materials for the promise eligible program minus the amount received from any grants, scholarships or other financial assistance awards that do not require repayment. If an eligible student enrolls in a scholarship eligible program at an eligible institution described in section 1(b)(1)(C), and amendments thereto, the scholarship amount shall be based on the average cost of tuition, mandatory fees and the cost of books and required materials for the program when offered by the eligible institutions described in section 1(b)(1)(A) and (B), and amendments thereto.
- (2) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, Kansas promise scholarships shall only be awarded to an eligible student whose family household income equals \$100,000 or less for a family of two, \$150,000 or less for a family of three, and for household sizes above three, a household income that is equal or less than the family of three amount plus \$4,800 for each additional family member. Kansas promise scholarships may be awarded to eligible students whose family household income exceeds such amounts only if scholarship moneys remain in the promise scholarship program fund during the award year after awarding all other scholarships pursuant to this section.
 - (b) To receive a Kansas promise scholarship, an eligible student shall:
- (1) Complete a scholarship application on such forms and in such manner as established by the state board;

 (2) complete the free application for federal student aid;

- (3) enroll in a promise eligible program at an eligible institution; and
- (4) enter into a scholarship agreement as provided in section 3, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 3. (a) As a condition to the award of a scholarship, an eligible student shall enter into a scholarship agreement with the state board. Such scholarship agreement shall require that the eligible student:
- (1) Enroll as a full-time or part-time student in a promise eligible program at an eligible institution and complete the promise eligible program;
- (2) maintain satisfactory academic progress toward completion of the promise eligible program;
 - (3) within six months of completion of the promise eligible program:
- (A) Reside in and commence work in the state of Kansas for at least two consecutive years; or
- (B) enroll as a full-time or part-time student in any public or not-forprofit postsecondary educational institution with its main campus or principal place of operation located in Kansas, and upon graduation or failure to re-enroll, reside in and commence work in the state of Kansas for at least two consecutive years;
- (4) maintain records and make reports as may be required by the state board to document the satisfaction of the obligations of the Kansas promise scholarship program; and
- (5) upon failure to satisfy the requirements of a scholarship agreement, repay the scholarship amount as provided in section 5, and amendments thereto.
- (b) The state board may postpone any requirement of a scholarship agreement for good cause in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the state board.
- (c) A scholarship recipient satisfies the requirements of the Kansas promise scholarship program if such recipient:
 - (1) Completes the requirements of the scholarship agreement;
- (2) commences service as a military servicemember after receiving a Kansas promise scholarship;
- (3) fails to satisfy the requirements after making the best possible effort to do so as determined by the state board; or
- (4) is unable to satisfy the requirements due to disability or death of the recipient.
- Sec. 4. The state board shall implement and administer the Kansas promise scholarship program. The state board shall:
 - (a) Identify the promise eligible programs offered by each eligible institution that provide a two-year associate degree program or a career and technical education certificate or stand-alone program in any of the

- (1) Information technology and security;
- (2) mental and physical healthcare; or
 - (3) advanced manufacturing and building trades; or
 - (4) early childhood education and development.
- (b) work with public and private secondary schools and community partners, such as community foundations and business, industry and economic development organizations to publicize Kansas promise scholarships, including, but not limited to, publicizing promise eligible programs, eligible institutions and application procedures and deadlines;
- (c) subject to appropriations therefor, distribute funds to eligible institutions for the purpose of awarding Kansas promise scholarships;
- (d) ensure that each scholarship recipient fulfills the requirements of the scholarship agreement entered into pursuant to section 3, and amendments thereto:
- (e) on or before March 1, 2022, adopt rules and regulations for the implementation and administration of the Kansas promise scholarship program; and
- (f) on or before January 15, 2022 2023, and each January 15 thereafter, prepare and submit a report to the legislature and the governor on the Kansas promise scholarship program. The report shall include, but not be limited to, the following information for the immediately preceding academic year:
 - (1) The total number of scholarship applications;
- (2) the total number of scholarship recipients and the total amount of scholarship moneys awarded;
- (3) the total number of scholarship recipients who completed an eligible postsecondary education program; and
- (4) the total number of scholarship recipients who satisfied the requirements of a scholarship agreement.
- Sec. 5. (a) If any scholarship recipient fails to satisfy the requirements of a scholarship agreement, such recipient shall pay to the state board an amount equal to the total scholarship amount received by such recipient plus accrued interest at a rate equivalent to the interest rate applicable to loans made under the federal PLUS program at the time such recipient first received a scholarship. All moneys received by the state board pursuant to this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas promise scholarship program fund created pursuant to section 6, and amendments thereto.
- (b) To collect upon any repayment account arising under the Kansas promise scholarship program, the state board may submit any repayment

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account over to a designated loan servicer or collection agency or may utilize the collection procedures provided in K.S.A. 75-6201 et seq., and amendments thereto.

New Sec. 6. There is hereby created in the state treasury the Kansas promise scholarship program fund, which shall be administered by the state board. All expenditures from the Kansas promise scholarship program fund shall be for scholarships awarded pursuant to the Kansas promise scholarship program. All expenditures from the Kansas promise scholarship program fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the executive officer of the state board or the designee of the executive officer. All moneys received by the board for the Kansas promise scholarship program shall be deposited in the state treasury in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas promise scholarship program fund. During any fiscal year, appropriations made to the Kansas promise scholarship program fund shall not exceed \$6,000,000.

Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
