Senate Bill 130 creates necessary additional protections against discrimination for persons of color by incorporating hair texture and protective hairstyles into the definition of race in the Kansas Act Against Discrimination.

As the scourge of racism continues to challenge educational achievement and quality of life for persons of color, this bill takes a positive step in ensuring more inclusive work and learning environments for our teachers and their students.
