Re: Prison Bed Impact Assessment, SB 220 – Increasing the penalty for battery committed

against a utility worker.

### IMPACT ASSESSMENT

This bill will have an impact on prison admissions and beds as well as the
workload of the commission, but due to the lack of information about utility
workers, it cannot be determined at this time.

### SUMMARY OF THE BILL

**Section 1.** K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 21-5413 is hereby amended to include "utility worker" which is defined as an employee of a Kansas registered utility company providing utility services such as electric, natural gas, broadband or cable services, water service, utility line clearance or line locate services. In addition, **battery against a utility worker is a level 7, person felony.** 

# **FINDINGS**

- In FY 2019, **738** offenders were convicted of the crime of battery. Of this number:
  - o 5 battery;
  - o 631 aggravated battery;
  - o 77 battery against a law enforcement officer;
  - o 18 aggravated battery against a law enforcement officer; and
  - o 7 battery against a mental health employee.
- There is no information available regarding battery against utility worker in the Commission databases.

## **IMPACT ASSESSMENT**

• This bill **will** have an impact on prison admissions and beds as well as the workload of the commission, but due to the lack of information about utility workers, it cannot be determined at this time.
