the crime of conducting a pyramid promotional scheme, providing for

an exemption and defining key terms. - UPDATE

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

SUMMARY OF THE BILL

This bill addresses pyramid schemes under K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 21-5838 and adds that the provisions of this section shall not be construed to prohibit a plan or operation, or to define a plan or operation as a pyramid promotional scheme, if the participants in the plan or operation give consideration in return for the right to receive compensation based upon purchases of goods, services or intangible property for personal use, consumption or resale if the plan or operation does not cause inventory loading.

This bill also defines the following terms:

- "Compensation" means a payment of any money, a thing of value or financial benefit conferred in return for inducing another person to participate in a pyramid promotional scheme.
- "Consideration" means the payment of cash or the purchase of goods, services or
 intangible property. "Consideration" does not include the purchase of goods or
 services furnished at cost to be used in making sales and not for resale, or time
 and effort spent in pursuit of sales or recruiting activities. "Consideration" does

- not include payment for sales demonstration, equipment and materials furnished at cost for use in making sales and not for resale.
- "Inventory" means both goods and services, including, but not limited to, company-produced promotional materials, sales aids and sales kits that an entity requires independent salespersons to purchase.
- "Inventory loading" means the requirement or encouragement by a plan or
 operation to have the independent salesperson of the plan or operation purchase
 inventory in an amount that exceeds the amount that the salesperson can expect to
 resell for ultimate consumption or to use or consume in a reasonable time period,
 or both.
- "Person" means an individual, corporation, trust, estate, partnership, unincorporated association or any other legal or commercial entity.
- "Promote" means to contrive, prepare, establish, plan, operate, advertise or otherwise induce or attempt to induce another person to participate in a pyramid promotional scheme.

FINDINGS

- In FY 2021, **0** offenders were convicted under K.S.A. 21-5838.
- In FY 2021, **0** offenders were arrested for violation of K.S.A. 21-5838.
