Re: Senate Bill No. 578

Senate Bill No. 578 is the annual statutory conflicts reconciliation bill. The statutory conflicts reconciliation bill combines amendments to certain statutes that have been amended multiple times during the current legislative session or prior legislative sessions. The purpose of the reconciliation bill is to combine non-contradictory amendments from enacted legislation to produce one version of the statute. Without legislative action to reconcile amendments, multiple versions of the statute will exist. The bill would make no substantive amendments to current law.

The bill would take effect upon publication in the statute book, July 1, 2022, so that the amendments are reconciled before the next version of the statute is printed in the Kansas Statutes Annotated.
