
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2060 by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2060 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Enactment of HB 2060 would establish central daylight-saving time as the permanent standard time for the state of Kansas beginning on the first Sunday of November after the effective date of the bill. The bill would require the Secretary of State to monitor and publish a notification of the enactment of any federal law that establishes year-round observation of central daylight-saving time.

The Secretary of State indicates that publication of a notification of enactment of a federal law establishing year-round central daylight-saving time is expected to cost approximately \$100, and the cost could be managed within existing resources. The Kansas Highway Patrol reports that it could experience minor adjustments to its budget only when the time change takes effect. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2060 is not reflected in *The FY 2022 Governor's Budget Report*.
