
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2615 by House Committee on K-12 Education Budget

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2615 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2615 would authorize school districts to provide alternative educational opportunities for students enrolled in grades six through 12 outside of the classroom for course credit with sponsoring entities. A sponsoring entity would include a business, nonprofit organization, trade association, parent of a student, teacher, or administrator that would partner with a school district to provide an alternative educational opportunity for students outside the classroom and would meet any course content standards, as determined by the State Board of Education.

The Department of Education indicates the enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on state aid to school districts or any administrative cost to the agency. Any fiscal effect on school districts that would choose to provide alternative educational opportunities for course credit would be borne by those school districts.
