**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2537**

As Amended by Senate Committee of the Whole

**Brief\***

HB 2537, as amended, would amend a statute governing hearings by the Commissioner of Insurance (Commissioner) to add a provision allowing a person subject to any order, as defined in the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act (KAPA), issued by the Commissioner to request a hearing on such order. If such a request is made, the bill would require the Commissioner to conduct a hearing in accordance with KAPA provisions.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

**Background**

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Judiciary at the request of a representative of O'Neal Consulting.

***House Committee on Judiciary***

In the House Committee hearing on February 1, 2022, a representative of O'Neal Consulting testified as a **proponent** of the bill, stating the bill would clarify the right of a person to request a hearing under KAPA regarding an order by the Commissioner. A representative of the Kansas Insurance Department provided written-only neutral testimony. No other testimony was provided.

### ***Senate Committee on Judiciary***

In the Senate Committee hearing on March 15, 2022, the same representative that testified in the House Committee testified as a **proponent** on the bill. Written-only neutral testimony was provided by a representative of the Kansas Insurance Department. No other testimony was provided.

### ***Senate Committee of the Whole***

On March 23, 2022, the Senate Committee of the Whole amended the bill to make it effective upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

### **Fiscal Information**

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, the Kansas Insurance Department states enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect.
